


For example... Giving flowers



CSI Detectives!

Your task: You are a team of detectives surveying a crime scene. Recreate the crime scene; tell us what happened!

Critical thinking is not just a technique used to write essays and complete maths problems; it is a skill you use all the time, without even thinking about it.





• **Problem:** A man marries twenty women in his village, but isn't charged with polygamy.



 Adults are holding children, waiting their turn. The children are handed (one at a time, usually) to a man, who holds them while a woman shoots them. If the child is crying, the man tries to stop the crying before the child is shot.



 Problem: A man walks into a café and asks for a drink. The staff member pulls out a gun and points it at him. The man says "thank you" and walks out.
